Reading & Language Arts

In ELA we are working on grammar skills. Students continue to develop their narratives. We are revisiting the elements during the process.

Identifying theme will still be our focus. We plan to test by the end of this week and move to the next reading standard.

Vocabulary books will return this week, so we are able to get unit 2 completed before September break.

Math

This week we will be working on addition and subtraction. Students will be expected to regroup with both operations, and to solve word problems.

Science/Social Studies

We are moving through the causes leading up to the American Revolution. We will be covering the Boston Tea Party and the Boston Massacre. Prominent people students will need to be familiar with are: King George, George Washington, John Adams, Sam Adams, Sons and Daughters of Liberty, Paul Revere, Crispus Attucks, Thomas Jefferson, and Ben Franklin. After the Declaration of Independence, we're going to war! Students will learn about key battles: Lexington and Concord, Saratoga, Yorktown. It is very advantageous for students to study their notes (SS journal) or Studies Weekly for a short time every day.
